ABOUT THE CONFERENCE

Since 1995 the Engineers' Society of Western Pennsylvania has presented an annual conference on the subject of brownfields reclamation. In fact, the ESWP was in the brownfields conference business even before the term "brownfields" was commonly used when referring to environmentally impaired sites. Back then, we conducted the "Industrial Site Recycling Conference" (ISRC) for 5 successful years. Since that time, ESWP has partnered with the U.S. EPA on the National Brownfields Conference for three very successful events in 2000, -01 and -02. In 2003 ESWP again sponsored its own conference returning to Pittsburgh's Sheraton Station Square Hotel with the "Business of Brownfields Conference", attracting over 300 attendees in both 2003 and 2004. In 2006, the "BoB" moved to Seven Springs Mountain Resort in Champion, PA, and then in 2007 returned to downtown Pittsburgh at the David L. Lawrence Convention Center. For 2010 we are pleased to return to the Sheraton Station Square Hotel with a refined agenda that reflect the comments we have received from surveying the 2009 attendees.
